

## **Monday, May 2, 2016 Monthly Meeting - Secretaries Report**

**7:30 p.m. - Meeting called to order**

**Board members in attendance: President Mark Patterson, Chief Range Safety Officer Jim Uffner and Secretary Laura Lucker**

**Meeting opened with The Pledge of Allegiance recited by the membership in attendance.**

**Reading of the Secretaries Report:** Following the reading of the secretaries' report, a motion to accept the report as read was made, seconded and approved without corrections or amendment by the members in attendance.

**Reading of the Treasures Report:** No financial report available.

**Reading of the Chief Range Safety Officers report:** Following the reading of the Chief Range Safety Officers report, a vote was asked to approve 5 applications for new membership which were approved by the membership in attendance. A motion to accept the report as read was made, seconded and approved without amendment by the members in attendance.

**Old Business:** The donated projector screen, along with the new overhead projector system, has been installed. \*\*\*The interest in a target positioning system, temporary stands, or retrieval systems was once again opened for discussion. This project is still active and ongoing. Unfortunately, those involved in the project were not available for updates so the discussion was tabled at this time. \*\*\*There was an update to the Tolsma Cup Club Challenge which is under way every Tuesday night during the months of May and June. Participates who enter into the Tolsma Challenge will be entered into a raffle where they have the opportunity to win a Ruger 10/22 or a Savage 17HMR rifle for the highest score, a Burris Red Dot scope for second and a brick of 22's for the third highest score. All prizes have been donated. With the approval by the membership, the entry fee of \$20.00 will be collected, with \$10.00 of the proceeds collected for club expenses and the remaining \$10.00 donated to the Tolsma scholarship fund.

**New Business:** \*\*\*Scott Fishburn announced that we will be switching over to the USCCA CPL training material for our May 22<sup>nd</sup> CPL classes as the program appears to provide a more comprehensive and complete training guide compared to the NRA program material we are currently using. \*\*\* Bryan Dixon announced the he will be holding an IDPA clinic, the International Defensive Pistol Association Shooting Clinic to learn how to shoot defensively using the same equipment you use for everyday concealed carry. The date is May 14th, 2016 8am-12pm here at the Club. \*\*\*Mark Patterson pointed out that at times, with all the activity at the club, that our club house, range and bathroom areas have needed a little extra cleaning and asked the member to be mindful of messes and help out by doing a little clean-up when you're visiting the club house. Everyone wants a clean environment while at the club or on the range and we really do not want to ward-off perspective new members by our lack of cleanliness. We have a place to be proud of, so let's help keep it that way. \*\*\*Neil Hays asked that the club membership consider the purchase of a second gun safe so that the range guns were readily available to all members and that important document could be stored more securely.

**New member applications:** There were 8 new applications present for membership. New applicants are responsible for contacting the Chief Range Safety Officer to complete their club orientation. Upon completion of the club orientation and on the recommendation of the Chief Range Safety Officer, new applicant approval will be put to a vote at the next scheduled club meeting June 6, 2016.

Along with that, several members brought up the discussion of reducing our noise levels by adding insulation to our attic space and even to considering the possibility of adding sound deafening material to the interior walls around the range.
